For Final Minor Modification Permitting Action Under 45CSR30 and Title V of the Clean Air Act

Facility Description

Harrison County Coal Company's facility operates a 2,800 tons per hour coal preparation plant. The facility has the potential to operate seven (7) days per week, twenty-four (24) hours per day and fifty-two (52) weeks per year. SIC Code: 1222.

This minor modification incorporates the modification permit R13-2306F to add a refuse conveyor C13 and a refuse truck loadout bin RB4.

Emissions Summary

With this modification, the potential emissions will increase for PM, PM_{10} , and $PM_{2.5}$ by 0.92 tpy, 0.44 tpy and 0.07 tpy respectively.

Title V Program Applicability Basis

With the proposed changes associated with this modification, this facility maintains the potential to emit 268.69. Due to this facility's potential to emit over 100 tons per year of criteria pollutant, Harrison County Coal Company is required to have an operating permit pursuant to Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act as amended and 45CSR30.

Legal and Factual Basis for Permit Conditions

The State and Federally-enforceable conditions of the Title V Operating Permits are based upon the requirements of the State of West Virginia Operating Permit Rule 45CSR30 for the purposes of Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act and the underlying applicable requirements in other state and federal rules.

Determinations and Justifications

This permit modification incorporates the modified R13-2306F permit which is to add a new refuse conveyor C13 and refuse truck loadout bin RB4 in order to convey refuse uphill, as opposed to using loaded trucks to transport it. Modifications to the Title V permit include the following:

- The "Emission Units" table was updated to add refuse conveyor C13 and refuse truck loadout bin RB4.
- Updated section 1.2 with permit R13-2306F information. Also corrected the section number to be 1.2.
- 3) Conditions 3.5.3., 3.5.5. and 3.5.6. These conditions were revised to incorporate Title V boilerplate changes that require electronic submittal of the Title V compliance certifications (annual and semi-annual), self-monitoring reports (MACT, GACT, NSPS, etc.), stack tests and protocols to the WV DAQ.
- 4) Condition 5.1.12. Added C13 and Refuse Bin 4 (RB4).
- **5)** Condition 5.2.3. Added C13 and Refuse Bin 4 (RB4).
- **6)** Updated APPENDIX A and APPENDIX B to reflect Permit R13-2306F.
