Facility Description

The Mount Olive Compressor Station is a natural gas transmission compressor station. Pipeline transmission of natural gas requires that the gas be compressed. The Mount Olive Compressor Station receives natural gas via pipeline from an upstream compressor station, compresses it using natural gas fired turbines, and transmits it via pipeline to a downstream station.

This modification is to incorporate R13-3314B which made administrative changes to the facility's permit.

Emissions Summary

There is no change in the facility's emissions due to the modification.

Title V Program Applicability Basis

With the proposed changes associated with this modification, this facility maintains the potential to emit 242.58 tpy of Carbon Monoxide and 120.47 tpy of Nitrogen Oxides. Due to this facility's potential to emit over 100 tons per year of criteria pollutant, Columbia Gas Transmission, LLC is required to have an operating permit pursuant to Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act as amended and 45CSR30.

Legal and Factual Basis for Permit Conditions

The State and Federally-enforceable conditions of the Title V Operating Permits are based upon the requirements of the State of West Virginia Operating Permit Rule 45CSR30 for the purposes of Title V of the Federal Clean Air Act and the underlying applicable requirements in other state and federal rules.

The modification to this facility has been found to be subject to the following applicable rules:

Federal and State: 45CSR13 NSR Permit

45CSR30 Operating permit requirement.

State Only: None

Each State and Federally-enforceable condition of the Title V Operating Permit references the specific relevant requirements of 45CSR30 or the applicable requirement upon which it is based. Any condition of the Title V permit that is enforceable by the State but is not Federally-enforceable is identified in the Title V permit as such.

The Secretary's authority to require standards under 40 C.F.R. Part 60 (NSPS), 40 C.F.R. Part 61 (NESHAPs), and 40 C.F.R. Part 63 (NESHAPs MACT) is provided in West Virginia Code §§ 22-5-1 *et seq.*, 45CSR16, 45CSR34 and 45CSR30.

- Revised the installation date for the equipment at the facility in condition 3.7.2.b.

Section 5.0 Emergency Generator RICE

- Updated section title.
- Updated condition 5.1.1. to add language which states the 500 hours per year requirement is for periods of non-emergencies.
- Updated the language in conditions 5.1.7, 5.4.1, and 5.5.2 based on changes to 40 C.F.R. 60, Subpart JJJJ.

Section 6.0 Heaters

• Updated citation of condition 6.1.2. The catalytic heaters are not indirect heat exchangers. Therefore, the heaters (HTR1, HTR2) that are subject to this permit condition were specified.
